Parent Session – Secondary School Applications

Applications for secondary school places are now open for current year 6 pupils who will be transferring to secondary school next September. There is not a year goes by without disappointment, when pupils do not receive their preferred choice of school. Sometimes this is simply because admissions criteria have not been met. Unfortunately, as was the case last year, it was because applications were submitted late, had information missing and in some cases had not been submitted. This was very distressing for many children and families and made worse by the fact that we are powerless and unable to influence or support the process and outcomes. To avoid this happening this year, we are offering the use of our IT facilities so parents can make sure applications are submitted in a timely and accurate manner. If you have not yet applied, or are unsure of how the process works, we recommend you attend our secondary school admissions evening on **Tuesday 10th October - 3:30-5pm** where you can access, complete and submit your application for your child's place at secondary school.
